NEW GLOUCESTER - Brian J. Wotton, 37, a resident of 1335 Lewiston Rd., New Gloucester died unexpectedly Tuesday afternoon as a result of an automobile accident on Route 100. He was born in New Britain, CT., on October 26, 1969 the son of Gary Wotton and Joanne LeVasseur Snyder. Brian attended Houlton schools and then relocated to Lewiston where he finished his education at CMVTI. After schooling, he worked gathering experience in the construction field before he began his own business in 1999. He was a devoted husband and father who loved his family.
