BANGOR- Cheyanne Karen Audet, 31, of Turner, Maine died unexpectedly surrounded by her loving family, extended family and friends on Thursday October 27, 2011 at Eastern Maine Medical Center in Bangor. She was born in Lewiston, Maine on October 13, 1980 the daughter of Francis B. Gurschick and Karen Gould. Cheyanne graduated from University of Maine in Augusta with an Associates Degree in Nursing in 2005. She later completed her Bachelor's Degree in Nursing through the University of Maine at Fort Kent in 2010. Cheyanne had been employed at Central Maine Medical as the Certified Wound Nurse Specialist and also volunteered with the Ostomy Association. She just recently became employed with American Medical Technologies as a Clinical Specialist traveling throughout the State of Maine educating nurses on best practice for wound care. She also obtained her Certified Legal Nurse Consulting Certification and worked very hard on building her dream of owning her own firm. Cheyanne enjoyed snowmobiling with her husband Adam, watching her daughter Lily play softball and her daughter Abby racing dirt bikes. She is survived by her husband Adam Audet whom she married on July 18, 2009 of Turner; her children Lilyan, Abigail and Darion; her siblings Francis Gurschick of Lewiston, Samuel Gurschick of Orlando, Florida and Alison Wix of Atwood, Tennessee; her maternal mother Karen and her husband Roger Asselin of Florida; her maternal grandmother Mae Holbrook Sennett of Minot and maternal grandfather Richard Gould of Lewiston; her Aunt Bev Nickerson and Aunt Barbie Gould and her Uncle Roger Sennett Jr., who gave her encouragement in all endeavors; numerous other aunts, uncles, cousins, nieces, nephews and friends who loved her dearly. “ I was a patient of Cheyanne's at CMMC for 2 months. Her office was next to my room in the hospital. Even though she spent alot of time with me on a nurse to patient basis, we became pretty close friends and I was very fond of her. She used to stop in every evening before she went home for the day to make sure that I was comfortable, and to see if there was anything tht she could do for me before she left for home. She was forever talking about her daughters, and her face lit up when she talked about her husband, who seemed to be the love of her life. When I was finally sent home for just a week, I was having a problem with my wound vac, which is a huge bandage that was placed over my huge abdominal incision. She gave my husband a crash coarse on what to do if there were any problems, and left him her work and personal cell phone number if he had any questions or problems when we were home. We were home for about 2 hours when the wound vac started leaking air. My husband immediately called Cheyanne, hoping that he would catch her before she left the hospital for the day. Unfortunately, she did leave, and my husband called her cell phone. She was on her way to her daughter's soft ball game here in Turner, but stopped by my house to see me before she went to her daughter's game. How surprised I was that she took the time out of her personal life to stop by my home to see me, and to fix the problem with my bandages. I quickly learned that not only was she a dedicated nurse at the hospital.....her job didn't stop there. As long as she was helping someone, and as long as she was involved in a case, her job never ended, even after she left the hospital. I was close to death when I was rushed into the ER back in March. I believe that Cheyanne was one of the few people that actually saved my life. How I loved that girl....not only for her medical expertise, but more importantly for her compassion and caring. There is not another human being like her, and I am grateful that she had a huge part in my hard and painful recooperation. Thank you, Cheyanne, for touching my life like no other has ever done. I love you more than words can say. Rest in peach beautiful angel of mine. You will NEVER be forgotton by my family and I.
