LEWISTON – Julien “Bill” A. Chasse 76, passed away peacefully early Wednesday morning August 5th at Central Maine Medical Center following a lengthy illness.

He was born in Lewiston, May 26, 1939, the son of Henri and Marie (Martin) Chasse.

Bill served for 11 years with the United States Army and Army National Guard during the Cold War and Vietnam Conflict.
