NORWAY- Norman G. Ricker, 86, of 35 Lincoln Drive, Lewiston died on Wednesday March 26, 2014 at Stephens Memorial Hospital in Norway, Maine following a brief illness. He was born in Lewiston, Maine on October 23, 1927 the son of the late Harold P. and Carmel (Fecteau) Ricker and had been a resident of this community all of his life. He was educated in Lewiston schools and was a graduate of Lewiston High School Class of 1946. He married the former Gratia Boucher in December of 1951; and she died on February 9, 1992. He served with the US Navy for 22 years from April 6, 1945 to November 1, 1966 having served in WWII, the Korean Conflict and in Vietnam. He was employed for fifteen years at Country Kitchen until his retirement in October of 1989. Norman was a parishioner of St. Mary's Church, American Legion Post 22, Dion-Longley VFW Post 9150, Le Passe Temps Club, Midtown Athletic Club, Lewiston Social, Hurricane and ACME Clubs. He is survived by three daughters Dale Redmun and her husband Brian of Lewiston, Robin L. Jacobsen of Lewiston and Christel C. Desjardins and her husband Guy of Sabattus; one son Scott A. Ricker and his wife Cindy of Huntersville, North Carolina; one brother Richard H. Ricker of Lewiston; six grandchildren; six great grandchildren; and several nieces and nephews.
