RAYMOND CHALOUX, beloved husband, father, brother, and son died unexpectedly on Monday, February 25 at the age of 53.

He was born on May 25, 1966, the first son of Gloria and Normand Chaloux, and thought the world of his parents and his younger brother Jason. He was raised in Lewiston on Blake Street and attended Lewiston schools. You would be hard pressed to find Ray in a bad mood. He was a cheerful, loving and funny person who was kind to every person he met and was the first person there to help anyone in need. He loved to reminisce about past shenanigans and his favorite family
